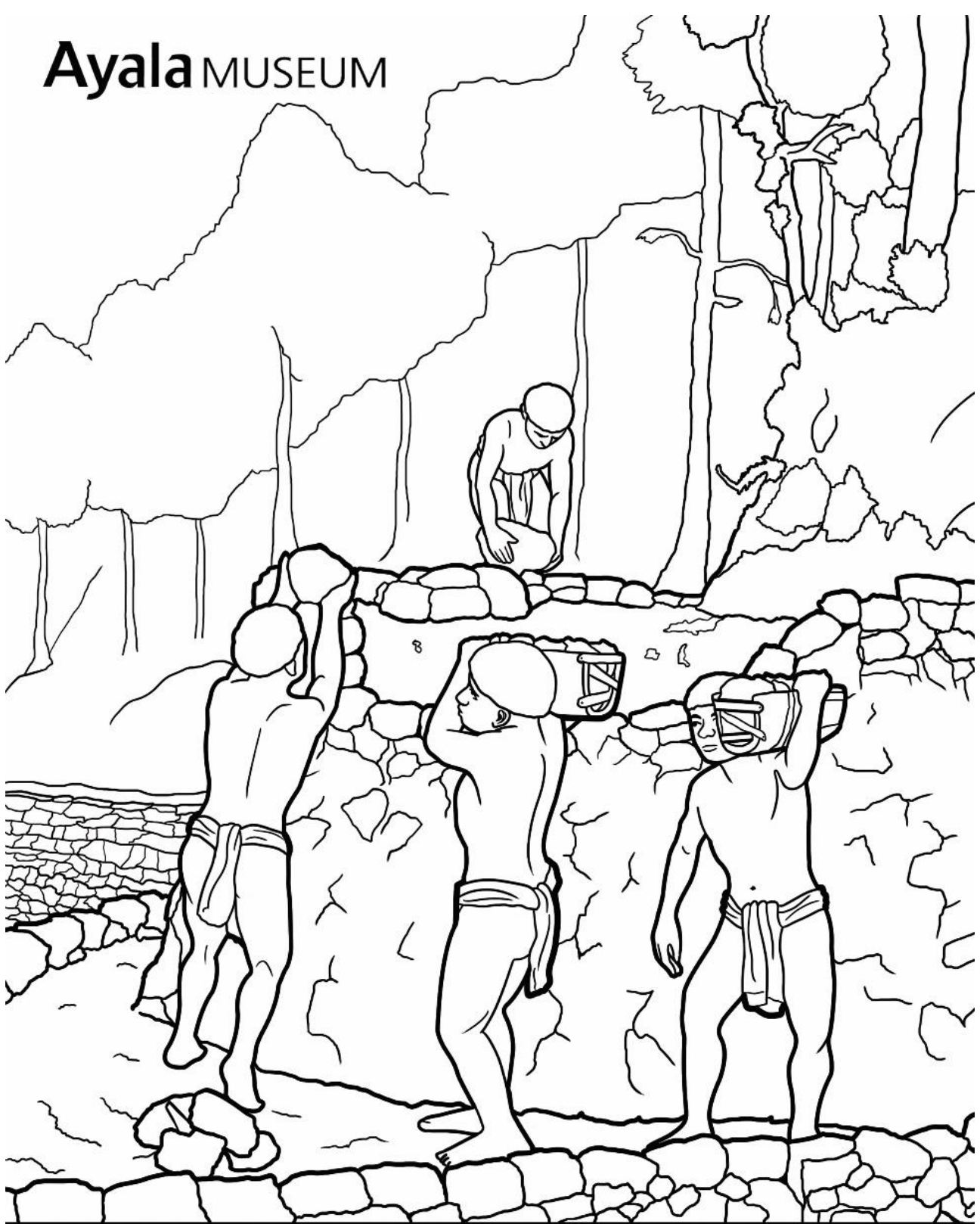

**Making your own container.**

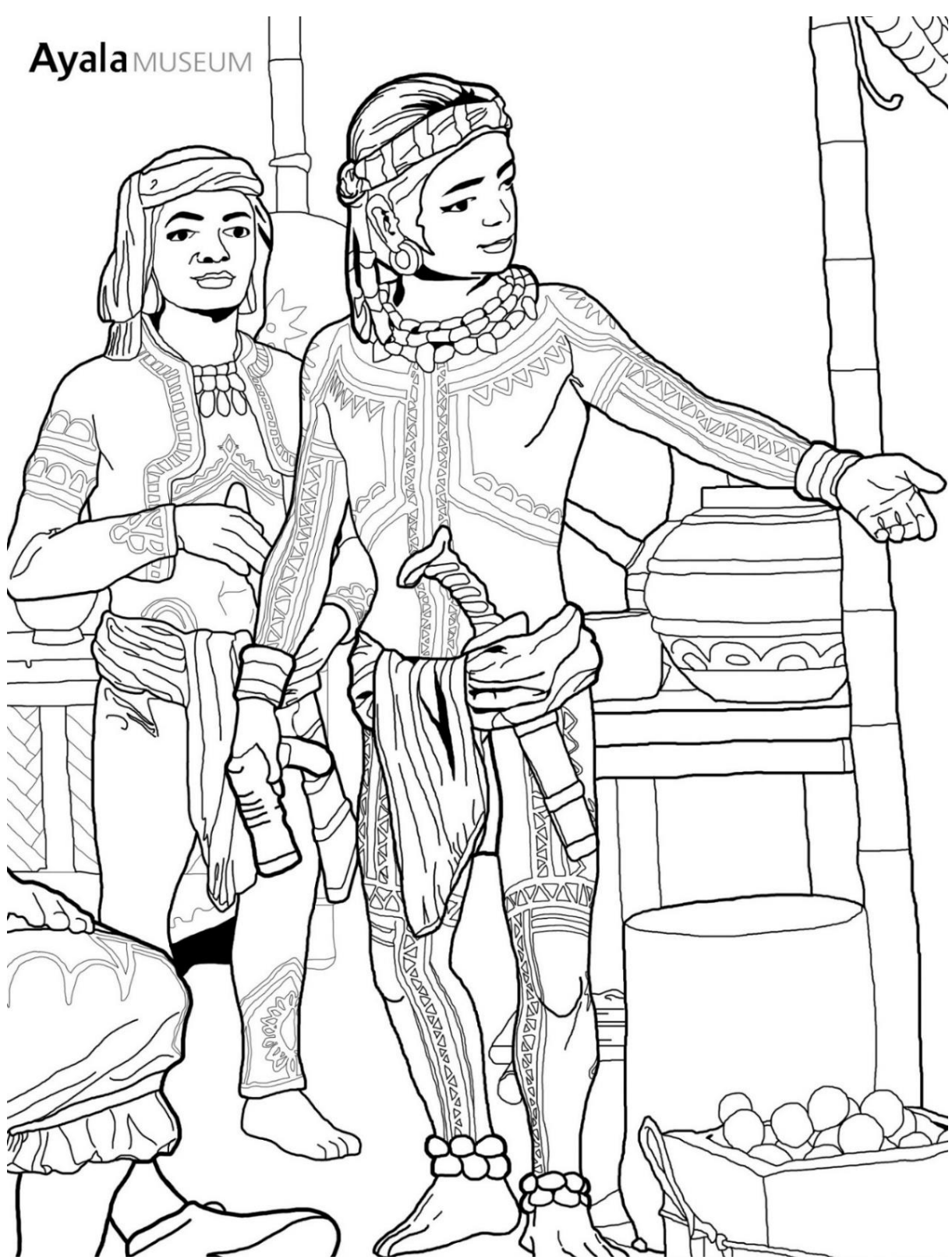
This picture shows a man and a woman making jars from clay. While clay is still wet, it is soft and can take different shapes. When it dries, it becomes hard. This is how jars used to be made. The wet clay is shaped by hand by rolling, pulling, pressing, and pinching the clay to shape. Jars were important because they were used as containers for water and food. People did not have refrigerators or plastic containers back then. Jars can also be used for cooking! Did you know that you can cook *kare-kare* and other delicious Filipino dishes in a clay pot?



## Farming on the mountainside

Filipinos love rice! How many cups can you eat?

Rice is delicious but it grows on flat land with a lot of water. The Ifugao people in North Luzon found a way to plant rice even on the mountainside! This picture shows how they built walls made of stone so that they could create flat terraces to grow rice. It's like a giant staircase of rice going up the mountains!
